Steve Taylor and Dave Paulus traveled to South America the first week of April to hunt with Gonzalo Llambi.

"I saw 200 red deer the first morning and over 40 stags, all in the roar! I stalked the largest for over 2 hours and finally had a 70 yard shot with a .280 Remington and 150 grain Nosler bullets. Dave passed on many and took his stag the evening of the first day with a 225 yard shot with his .30/06 and 180 grain Nosler bullets.

This is a first class operation from greeters at the airport to cooks, staff, guides and gauchos. They have lots of horses if you prefer, we do not.

The second day we took photos of Dave's stag and then went in search of blackbucks.

The amount of game is amazing. All the deer hunting is on 20,000 acres and about 6000 foot elevation. It reminded me of eastern Colorado. They also have axis deer, fallow deer, boars and more.

The doves shooting was fun, not high volume but maybe 2 boxes of shells an hour so there is plenty of action and your shoulder isn't sore for a month afterwards. The dove shooting is on Acclaim Gonzalo's family home and there are 30,000 acres and more than enough birds.

Your wife will never forgive you if you don't take her along on this trip.
